**2<sup>nd</sup> August 1891 (Poole) to 6<sup>th</sup> March 1976 (Southampton)**

**Victor Aged 27 (1918)**

(Victor helped with the Original Set of requirements for the badge and was recognized personally by King Edward VII and Baden-Powell)

**Arthur Primmer** of 1st Hamworthy Scouts – Poole – November 1909



**3<sup>rd</sup> February 1892 (Poole) to 28<sup>th</sup> May 1983 (Poole)**

**Arthur Aged 22 (1914)**

(Arthur was one of the Original Campers on Brownsea Island in 1907, from the Poole Boys Brigade and was recognized personally by Baden-Powell)

*Victor and Arthur were both great friends. They were responsible for the creation of the very first Scout Groups in the Area. After attending a Scouting Meeting that was held at what is now 1<sup>st</sup> Parkstone Scouts back in February 1908. Victor who lived in Broadstone wanted to start a group more local to him, and with Arthur's Assistance founded Broadstone Scouts in June 1908.*

*After the success of setting up Broadstone, Arthur then wanted to start a Troop in his local Parish of Hamworthy, where in October 1908 he started what is now 1<sup>st</sup> Hamworthy Scout Group.*
